

Worked All New Mexico Grids (WANaMuG) Award

In order to promote VHF+ activity in and around the State of New Mexico, the New Mexico VHF Society is sponsoring a new and challenging award. The *Worked All New Mexico Grids Award* is available to any licensed amateur radio operator confirming QSOs with the 22 grids that occupy all or some portion of the State of New Mexico. These grid squares are as follows: DM51, DM52, DM53, DM54, DM55, DM56, DM61, DM62, DM63, DM64, DM65, DM66, DM72, DM73, DM74, DM75, DM76, DM82, DM83, DM84, DM85, and DM86.

This award is available using mixed bands and modes. There are two ways to qualify for this award:

1. Confirm contacts with all 22 New Mexico grids from a fixed location, using any band or combination of amateur bands at frequencies 50 MHz and higher, using any mode or combination of modes.
2. Activate all 22 New Mexico grids as a portable, mobile, or contest rover station, using any band or combination of amateur bands at frequencies 50 MHz and higher, using any mode or combination of modes.

Grids that are partially in the State of New Mexico do not require that operations be within the state. QSOs originating anywhere within the four-digit grid square are acceptable. A remotely controlled fixed station may be used, but that station must transmit from only one location. Applicants do not need to be a member of the New Mexico VHF Society.

The following contacts are ineligible for this award:

1. Aeronautical mobile, use of analog or digital repeaters, and cross-band operations.
2. Contacts made before 1 October 2017.

Awards to be confirmed by paper QSL cards or ARRL Logbook of the World (LoTW). Apply directly to the NM VHF Society Secretary. QSL confirmation must accompany the application.

The New Mexico VHF Society will assign a permanent award number and display the award holders on the NMVHF.org website. The Society will provide and ship the award to successful applicants.
